




FIRST NATIONS BROKE THE SILENCE







THE ACT IN BRIEF:

Support Indigenous families in their search for information from an institution, body or religious congregation about the circonstances surrounding the disappearance and death of children

UNLOCKS THE MEDICAL FILES
UNLOCKS THE RELIGIOUS DOCUMENTS

- hospital centre / sanatorium
- foster family
- child and youth protection center
- cimetery/ parish, etc...

- child (minor) went missing before december 1992

- any family member of the child can request information

- assist families for an order of desinterment (repatriation)

- if the child is still alive, help to find where he or she was adopted






