

PEDESTAL COMP












WHITE MAN, GREETING!

Upper Burial Area (at 4' depth)
 Consists of a bed of sand and ash, two earthen pits
 by four pits, built to the north and west toward the
 mastaba's center. Two pits, two stone boxes, a pyramidal
 pit, and two stone slabs were found near these pits.

Mastaba Tomb Burial (at 24' - 31' depth)
 A chamber vault. It is a 7.5m x 10m chamber with a
 vaulted ceiling, built of brick, plaster, animal bones split lengthwise
 and built, set in the base of the mound.

The tomb's floor was carefully level with the back, and
 then covered with a thick layer of charred, tan, white
 lichen-wood ashes. On this, a central body was placed,
 covered with animal hair, kept facing north. Copper
 headless remains, six shell beads and a large blue
 glass bead were found.

On each side of the body lay five objects, six objects back
 wrapped, arranged in two semi-circles with their feet
 facing the central individual, not quite heading, both
 skeletons on the left side had a fine new black head.
 The more southern one also had a thick dark chest
 possibly pectoral, and animal shells. Nothing was found
 with them at the west.

Smaller Vault and Body Burial
 A clay covered vault (7m x 4' deep) containing several
 small, dark, and brown and light brown, finished but
 not before the natural ground surface. Beneath the
 vault-shaped bottom were two blue-gray lined vases,
 each having a five-spoked, blackish charcoal
 decorated floor base to further pieces of yellow beads,
 each found at the top corresponding skeletons.
